Short-Term Funding for Critical Needs

The Board of Trustees recently approved a proposal to pursue a Certificate of Participation (COP) of approximately \$15 million to provide funding for six institutional needs deemed critical to the future of Cerritos College educational programs. They are:

Health Occupations Skills Lab – a state-of-the-art facility with a larger clinic, computer lab, mock pharmacy, upgraded equipment, and classroom space to preserve the integrity and accreditation standing for all of the Health Occupations programs.

Additional Classroom Space – an additional 6,500 square feet of classroom space serving all college programs currently operating in small, overcrowded classrooms.

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) – software that seamlessly integrates Fiscal Services, Human Resources and Student Services, and provides better web-based services to students, faculty and staff.

Resurface Parking Lots – Asphalt resurfacing and preservation, with repainting of directional striping and signs in lots deemed unsafe and with wasted space that could

Space Station Mock-up Will Move to New Home

The life-size model of a space station that sits in a parking lot at Cerritos College will soon be moved as part of an agreement reached with the Aerospace Legacy Foundation in Downey.

The full-scale mock-up was originally donated to the college by Rockwell International in 1995. It had been built for NASA in the 1980s when Rockwell competed for the contract.

The Aerospace Legacy Foundation acquires and preserves the artifacts and heritage of local aerospace history related to the former Rockwell facility in Downey. The facility now belongs to the city of Downey.
